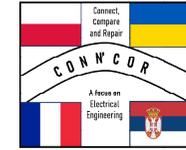

## **R2.3d Report on inclusion of learning assistants in teaching.**

This report presents a comparative analysis of the implementation of Learning Assistants (LA) across four partner institutions participating in the CONN'COR project: CentraleSupélec (CS), Lviv Polytechnic National University (LPNU), Bialystok University of Technology (BUT) and University of Nis (UNI). The document follows a standardized structure to facilitate comparison of approaches, outcomes, and recommendations across institutions.

### **1. Introduction and General Purpose**

The aim of introducing LAs, as stated in the project proposal is to support students in understanding difficult issues and to create a more friendly learning environment, taking into account the mental barrier. Students often feel anxious about asking the teacher questions due to fear of assessment, a sense of teacher-student hierarchy, and a lack of a sense of partnership in the learning process. Assistance from an older student during classes, who does not evaluate the student but can only motivate them without providing ready-made solutions, should be well-regarded by the students themselves. By definition the LA must have approximately the same age as the students he/she will help and, if possible, should have similar experience as a student.

The courses were chosen by each partner due to the specific difficulties it causes students and because of the lecturer's desire to conduct such a teaching experiment.



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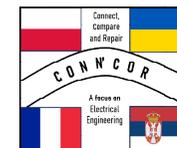

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### 3. Learning Assistants Profile and Recruitment

#### 3.1. Recruitment Criteria

The recruitment criteria were jointly established by the project partners: a) the student should be enrolled in a semester higher than the one of the selected course/subject; b) the student should be open to communication with others, including the teacher; c) the student’s willingness to take on such a role, d) the ranking of students' grades is not a significant criterion taken into account for candidates for this role.

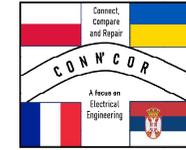
All partners used open announcements and conducted individual interviews with candidates. Due to the innovative nature of this role, there were no willing candidates, and there was no need to conduct a special application process (for each partner). Therefore, the students who volunteered for this role were chosen.

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## 9. Summary and Conclusions

This initiative, implemented by all partners across various semesters and study levels, shows that students greatly value support from senior colleagues in acquiring knowledge and skills. Assistants share their experiences and provide practical tips, such as preparing for classes, learning theoretical content, and developing exam preparation strategies. Informal tips provided by peers are often considered more credible and effective than those offered by teachers.

The barrier of hierarchy (teacher-student) and the teacher's position as the person assessing the student play a crucial role here. Therefore, it is easier for students to ask assistant questions because they know they will not be assessed.

Assistants also benefit from this cooperation, as they consolidate their knowledge, deepen their understanding of the material, and gain great satisfaction from seeing their positive impact on the work of their younger colleagues.

This practice, applied by all partners, shows that it is even worth introducing into the education system (higher schools and universities).

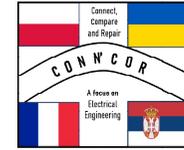

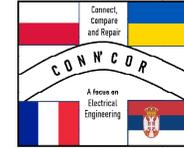
